2	Update on the Drop-in The Drop-in was well attended, with some 134 residents attending. VB queried whether the numbers in the Parish newsletter were correct as the numbers for the Cox Lane to Icepits/Barton Hamlets site were a lot higher than those reported previously to the group by email. SD agreed to check the numbers and report back. SD has now confirmed that the number for the site is 39 not 105.		
	The household questionnaire exercise revealed a clear desire to limit further growth in the village. The drop-in event helped to explain the potential for Great Barton to deliver more housing in the future. It provided residents with the opportunity to vote for where this growth should go, if needed. Residents expressed a preference for future growth to be confined to the Triangle (117) followed by the site adjacent to Freedom Church (56) and Cox Lane to Icepits/Barton Hamlets (39).		
	The next steps are to seek advice from Suffolk County Council regarding the infrastructure requirement for more housing developments. Their attendance, as well as that of our consultant, at our meeting in August would be helpful.	NC
