GREAT BARTON PARISH COUNCIL:

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In this early summer edition of your Parish Newsletter it is customary to state the roles of the Councillors for the coming year. As the deadline for submissions to the Newsletter has been brought forward these will now be in the late summer/early Autumn edition.

As most of you know I often provide parameters of our recent weather with comparisons to one of many previous years that can stretch back to 1910. There will be no statistics this time only to state that many people in the agricultural business are drawing parallels of the year so far to 1976, and don't we know (well, you need to be 50 or over!) what a summer that produced, hot and dry with rocketing vegetable prices and combine harvesting finishing for many a farmer in July!

There are 3 topics in my contribution to this Newsletter.

West Suffolk Operational Hub (WSOH) Housing Need Survey (HNS)

Neighbourhood Plan - Where on the ladder towards adoption

West Suffolk Operational Hub (WSOH):

I am pleased to state the 3 Parish Councils of Fornham St Martin cum Genevieve, Fornham All Saints and Great Barton (known as the Community Liasion Group. CLG) will be continuing discussions with the developers (St Edmundsbury Borough Council, Forest Heath District Council and Suffolk County Council) during the construction phases to ensure we can forward to parishioners forthcoming events and provide feedback to SEBC et al.

When the group met in March the CLG requested there was a chairperson appointed. This has been taken on board and the 3 Parish Councils are delighted to see the appointment of Cllr Sarah Broughton who is our ward councillor for St Edmundbury Borough Council. Councillor Broughton will be in the chair throughout the construction phase. The aim of the discussions is to be informed of developments, how this will impact on our communities and where possible ensure these are minimised as far as is practically possible to the local residents of Fornham St Martin and Great Barton.

At the 3rd May meeting we were introduce to the main contractor, Morgan Sindall. A transport plan is imminent from this contractor of the designated routes for heavy plant and contractor staff.

We were informed the main buildings on the site will need to have piling foundations and the site will have 2.5 m of earthworks moved from the north east corner to then raise the south west corner by 4 metres. We will be seeking the visual impact this will have on the site when compared to the planning elevations.

The foul drain outlet for the West Suffolk Operational Hub will have a pipeline thrust bored under the A134 to then go down Barton Hill to the connection at the Barton Hill/B1106 junction. We have asked for this work to coincide with lowest activity on Barton Hill which is the summer school holiday period. We expect more details at the next meeting.

Housing Need Survey (HNS) 2017

In the last Newsletter a brief summary of the findings from the HNSurvey was delivered and now after verification I can bring further analysis forward. The survey was to determine the need of housing across all tenure types in the Parish. The survey aimed to understand the existing and future needs for residents including family members (not necessarily living in the parish) and other members of the household.

The majority (36) of respondents indicated they would ideally like 2 bedrooms followed by 3 bedroom homes.

Recommendations:

The analysis from the Housing Needs Survey provides an indication of those in need of new housing for those who have a local connection to Great Barton. The analysis of data provided by the respondents showed a need for new homes to accommodate the identified 80 households (130 individuals) in need of housing comprising of a mix of property types, bedroom numbers and tenures.

The recommended number of affordable homes a parish may wish to provide is based generally on a third or half of the overall need indicated by the survey.

Conclusions:

Surveys returned completed, 465 out of 883 distributed = 53%

Out of 465 surveys returns 56 households responded identifying a current need for 88 people.

Out of 465 surveys returned 24 households indicated a need for 42 family members with a local connection wishing to live in or return to the village.

The Home-Link register indicates there are:

Active applicants indicating a preference to live in Great Barton – 39 Active applicants indicating a local connection to Great Barton – 113 households The financial information provided by respondents would suggest that a mix of tenure of properties in Great Barton should be considered.

Neighbourhood Plan – Drop In Session – 21st April 2018

On behalf of the Neighbourhood Working Party may I thank the 134 residents who took time out to study the 5 Strategic Housing Land Assessment Availability (SHLAA) sites and other sites suggested at the Village Hall on 21st April.



Hello, my name is Emily Martin. Ed has kindly offered me a column in the newsletter to write about preparing for and attending the World Scout Jamboree in July 2019. I have been selected to be part of the joint Suffolk & Norfolk Unit of 36 scouts. Thank you so much: I'm now nearly a quarter of the way there!

HEALTH CARE RECORDS CONSENT

You may be aware that NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk and NHS West Suffolk clinical commissioning groups recently launched a campaign to encourage people to give consent for their health record to be made accessible to health and care professionals in the event of an emergency.



Great Barton War Memorial, Churchyard of the Holy Innocents, Church Road, Great Barton, Suffolk – Awarded Listed Building Status List Entry Number: 1454092

We have been considering adding the above memorial to the List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest.

We have taken into account all the representations made, and completed our assessment of the memorial. I am pleased to inform you that having considered our recommendation, the Secretary of State for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport has decided to add Great Barton War Memorial to the List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest. The memorial is now listed at Grade II.

Please follow the link below to download a copy of our advice report, which gives the principal reasons for this decision. The List entry for this building, together with a map, has now been published on the National Heritage List for England, and will be available for public access from tomorrow. This List can be accessed through our website.

The local planning authority will now be preparing the statutory notices required under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest.

Calthorpe & Edwards Educational Foundation

This Foundation has existed for over 250 years to help young people under the age of 25 with study materials and books required for Further Education. In effect, this means any course which is NOT offered at Upper School/Community College. This includes NVQs which are not offered in schools.

The grant, which is usually limited to a maximum of 3 years, may be extended, at the discretion of the Trustees, by one year but to no person over the age of 25. To qualify the applicants must reside in one of 13 parishes:

Category A (known as the five Inner Parishes) includes Ampton, Ingham, Great & Little Livermere and Timworth

Category B (known as the eight Outer Parishes) includes Culford, Fornham St. Genevieve, Fornham St. Martin, **Great Barton**, Ixworth, Troston, West Stow and Wordwell.

Should there be a waiting list, preference will be given to those from Category A. At present the annual grant, paid in three equal instalments, is:

\pm £300 per annum

However this amount may vary from year to year dependent on the number of applicants.
