November 2024 -- Update on The Triangle Development

In March 2023 I provided a brief and hopefully a concise history of development since 2010 of the Triangle, (the area between Mill Road, A143 The Street and School Road), that came forward for development. In November 2022 a draft Development Brief, prepared on behalf of West Suffolk Council and Suffolk County Council, was the subject of a public consultation. The Newsletter of March 2023 stated the numerous concerns within the Development Brief, and this can be located within the dedicated area for The Triangle development on the Parish website: https://greatbarton-pc.gov.uk/the-triangle-development/

On 5 November 2024 the Cabinet Committee of West Suffolk Council decided to adopt a slightly revised Development Brief as informal planning guidance. On behalf of the Parish Council, The Triangle Taskforce expressed profound concern that the Development Brief does not give sufficient regard to the policies within the Neighbourhood Plan. The 150 dwellings stated in the Neighbourhood Plan have never been subject to the normal respected processes of viability for an adopted planning document. Consequently, the increase in the number of houses from 150 to between 184-191 has not been sufficiently justified. The land set aside for Community uses is less than 2 hectares. No community buildings such as a convenience shop, Post office or coffee shop will be provided by the developer, with only a space reserved for a future build. Sarah Broughton, our District Councillor and local resident Elaine Read also expressed their concerns.

The Academy Trust and the staff of Great Barton Primary School also have concerns that the proposals within the Development Brief for the Car Park/Drop-Off and the MUGA (Multi Use Games Arena) facilities do not meet the needs of the school. The Academy Trust and School staff are concerned that the proposed locations of these facilities, along with the additional 1.1 hectares for a possible expansion of the school, will not be satisfactorily integrated.

New Year 2025:-

Barley Homes (a house builder company owned by West Suffolk Council) will be submitting an Outline Planning Application for the whole site in the New Year, together with a detailed Planning Application for Phase 1, which will include 40 homes alongside School Road and will have its' access/egress off Mill Road. This Phase 1 build will also include a Car Park and Drop-Off for pupils attending the Primary School to relieve the congestion on School Road and the adjoining roads. This facility will also assist with future proofing our Primary School when it comes to its' expansion.

When the planning application is submitted this will be our best and last chance to influence:-

- Access and egress to the development,
- The connectivity of footpaths and cycleways within and beyond the development,
- The housing layout within a landscape setting,
- The housing design, building materials and architectural details,
- The incidental play areas.

If you have views on the design of The Triangle over and above the points stated, please do make sure that you comment on the Planning Applications when they are published on West Suffolk Council's Planning Website.

Information about The Triangle Development has been put onto the Parish Council website and we will update the information when the planning applications have been submitted.

We will still have the opportunity to influence the design - the adopted Development Brief is there only as guidance.

I would very much like to thank members of The Triangle Taskforce for their continuing endeavours to achieve a development that compliments the character of our village. Also, the Parish Council in providing the financial resources to contract with professional services to support the work of The Triangle Taskforce in our efforts to acquire the amenities/facilities and homes in a green setting.

News from the Chair

Well, here we are again time has passed quickly. This is the last newsletter before Christmas. The Parish Council has been working hard in the parish on your behalf. Thank you to the Parish Councillors both new and old. Special thanks to David Clarke for all his hard work whilst serving the Parish Council as he has decided to stop being a Parish Councillor. This does mean there are vacancies for 3 councillors please give it some thought, if you have the time and energy we would welcome you.

The main thing has been the change to the bus route though the village. Simmonds the bus company have been taken over by Vectare Buses, they have decided that the route through Livermere Road is not financially viable for them and removed this service. It is not safe for children to be waiting for the school bus on the A143 in either direction. It is also unhelpful to the older residents in the village to walk from Livermere Road to the A143. It's a long walk through the village especially if you have shopping bags, walking sticks and rough pavements. If people don't have friends and family to help then they have lost their independence, which when you are old is terrible. To sign the petition either go to change.org and go to the Great Barton bus petition or find it on the Parish website. The Parish Council will continue to campaign for reinstatement for the children's and older resident's use. Villages are poorly served by public transport.

I have no update on The Severals housing (by the railway bridge), I am waiting to hear what is going to happen there.

As you will see from the Triangle development update on pages 2 and 3 the Triangle Taskforce have been working very hard on behalf of our village. I would like to thank Philip Reeve and Vivien Bodner for their tireless work to get the best we can out of this. The Parish Council will continue to support them and get the best for the village.

A meeting was held to discuss the proposals for Elm Meadow which is the 71.9 acre field between Ice Pits Wood, the A143 and Cox Lane. This is land owned by Suffolk County Farms, the tenancy came to an end in October 2023 and they have retired the land from agricultural use. Suffolk County Councils 'Carbon Negative Nature Positive 'programme have created a design that will create a community asset and to enhance biodiversity on the land. It will provide a footpath between Cox Lane, Icepits Wood and the Bridleway to Green Lane.

They will provide habitat types, woodland, scrub, species rich grassland, hedgerow a community orchard. There will be a wood land along the A143 with native species. This will not be maintained at Great Barton Parish Council expense. This is an ongoing project and I will keep you updated. The new footpath will be part of this.

The Forestry Commission came to advise them and they looked at Icepits Wood while they were here and I have been told it was a well-maintained wood.

During the first week in October Highways at Suffolk County Council carried out a survey at the junction of A143, Brand Road / Thurston Road (Bunbury Arms junction). This is because they are looking at making capacity/safety improvements. It is at the early stages of design feasibility; the survey will show how the junction is currently operating e.g. volumes/types of vehicle traffic, vehicle turning and pedestrian movements. This will help inform design development. The survey involved loops across each arm of the crossroads and CCTV to capture all relevant traffic and pedestrian data.

Unfortunately, there have been a few incidents of anti-social behaviour reported in the playground and playing fields. If you witness any anti-social behaviour, please report it to the police immediately. You can report incidents anonymously if you prefer.

War Memorial – many thanks to Malcolm Turnbull who has kindly volunteered to care for the War Memorial and clean when required.

See the advert in this edition of the newsletter for a Christmas lunch for the elderly in our Village, if you want to come put your name down as places are very limited this year. It will be in the Church Institute this year hence the limited space.

The Village Hall Christmas Coffee Morning is on the 7th December 2024 please come and celebrate.

I have still been asking Suffolk County Council to skirt back footpaths, especially on the A 143 with the bus changes.

I really haven't got any moans except the usual speeding and dog poo this time.

As you are aware Simonds ceased running the 304/338/337 bus routes as of 2nd of September they had become commercially unviable, the Parish Council was not informed. Your Parish Council have been working with Councillor Rebecca Hopfensperger on a petition which shows the strength of feeling about the lack of bus on the routes. As a member of the Parish Council task force (save our buses) she has asked for feedback on whether the current routes are working well or not and particularly whether the 73 has

alleviated the overcrowding issue on the 70 & 70a. Please forward your comments to the Clerk by either emailing clerk@ greatbarton-pc.gov.uk or calling 07596 868600. There are various options being proposed to help rural village bus routes one being a bid to obtain funding for a Bus Improvement Programme to extend and enhance the 70, 70a and 73, we will of course update you with further information when it is available.



We have Teaching Meetings and Work Shops, on two or more Mondays in the month. These vary from Laptops, iPad and Mobile Phone sessions.


There is also an opportunity to speak to somebody, at the meetings, during the tea break, if you have a specific problem.

Message from Revd Benjamin Edwards

One of the best parts of being a priest is the wonderful array of people you meet, from all walks of life and with a variety of different personalities, skills, talents and experiences.

I've met people who have been on expeditions to uncharted areas of Brazil. I've met a Scottish man who is walking to every city in Britain and spoke fluent Latin. I've met Royalty, I've met a 'suspension artist' (Warning! Google at your peril!), newsreaders, amazing people who run charities that just happened because they had an idea and saw it through, people of all faiths and backgrounds.

So many people that bring a wealth of different perspectives and experiences – I love to hear their stories and insights, celebrate their joys and commiserate their sorrows. They become part of the richness of our lives, either fleetingly or as a regular part of our milieu. They may start as strangers, but they needn't stay strangers for long.

One of the callings of the Christian faith is to welcome the stranger – to provide hospitality, fellowship and care to those who are new to our community. In fact, it's one of the central tenets of the faith.

In the midst of much new home building in our area, amongst the real concerns of lack of infrastructure, loss of

green space, environmental concern and changing face of villages, there is also the joy of welcoming new people to our communities – people hoping to find a place to settle – young people buying their first house together, young families hoping for a safe community to raise children, older people moving away from cities ready for retirement. All these people have their own experiences, skills, talents and personalities waiting to be discovered and shared, waiting to become part of these communities. Despite all of the concerns that many quite rightly have about new housing popping up, there is the wonderful opportunity of meeting and getting to know new people, and welcoming them with kindness and friendliness as they help to shape the future of the communities

I wonder what stories they will bring? What will they add to our common lives together? Will they be a blessing or a lesson? And how might we show them the welcome we would hope to receive were it us arriving?




